Padre Dagoberto Noguera

Fr. Kavungal Davy: We all are shocked and saddened to learn about the sudden demise of Father Dagoberto who served our parish almost seven years. Due to health issues he retired in 2011 and returned to his home country, Columbia. He was brutally murdered in his residence in Columbia. The robbers slit his throat. The funeral service was attended by thousands of people on Monday, March 12.

I recall his annual visit to our parish. Parishioners kept hugging him and spent lot of time with him. He was such a simple, dedicated, noble, sincere and people oriented priest. He made a lasting impression especially in our Hispanic community. We will truly miss him. Let his murderers be forgiven. I invite you all to participate in the **Memorial Mass for him on Friday, March 23 at 7:30 PM, Celebrant Bishop Octavio Cisneros and Homilist Fr. Robert Czok.** May his soul Rest in Peace!

Fr. Robert Czok: St. Anthony/St. Alphonsus Parish was blessed to have had Father Dagoberto Noguera as a dedicated Parochial Vicar for almost seven years. We have all been shocked and deeply saddened by the violence that took his life at his residence in Colombia. He was a true servant of the People of God, a role he fulfilled with distinction. He especially provided a very much needed impetus to the life and activities of the Hispanic community here at SASA. With his priestly and zealous leadership the people received strong support and encouragement in their desire to participate more fully in the overall aims of the parish, lending increased vitality to the entire parish community. He fostered reverence and devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament, fervent devotion to our Blessed Mother, gave spiritual guidance to the Charismatic Renewal, supported cultural activities, inspired social life and fund-raising activities for the parish, and found the time and energy to help the disabled through gathering up wheelchairs and other types of equipment for distribution to the handicapped in his native Colombia. In fact, his commitment to reach out to the needy continued into his retirement years at his home base in Colombia, Santa Marta. Indeed, his life was brought to its end in the process of his charitable involvement. Reportedly, he was sending help to people in troubled Venezuela at the time of his untimely and tragic demise.

Finally, he was a pastoral priest who was not afraid to acquire the "smell of the sheep," as he so closely identified with and loved the people he served. He had a sense of humor and loved to laugh, but those who knew him would not ascribe to Father Dagoberto a flighty personality. Rather he was a truly human being who was possessed of a strong and assertive nature, which could sometimes be challenging to others, but at the same time giving drive and intensity to his priestly endeavors.

May God grant him the reward of his labors and eternal rest in the company of the angels and saints of heaven!

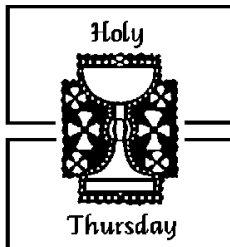
