Este domingo celebramos el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. El Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, instituido en 1926 por el Papa Pío XI, recuerda nuestra responsabilidad por la difusión del mensaje del Evangelio. El Papa Francisco ha pedido que se celebre el "Mes Misionero Extraordinario" en octubre de 2019 con el objetivo de fomentar la conciencia de nuestro llamado bautismal a ser misioneros.

La Iglesia es por su propia naturaleza misionera. Hoy dos tercios de la humanidad no conocen a Cristo. Necesitan conocerlo a él y su mensaje de salvación. El Señor nos llama a compartir con otros las bendiciones que hemos recibido. Convertirse en misionero es una dimensión esencial para ser católico. Todos somos misioneros por el bautismo.

Hoy vemos con alegría que los misioneros provienen no solo de las Iglesias más establecidas, sino también de las Iglesias de África, Asia y América Latina. El Domingo Mundial de las Misiones es una invitación para que todos se solidaricen con las misiones. Las necesidades materiales y financieras de las misiones son muchas y crecen a diario.

A menudo pensamos que para ser misioneros, tenemos que ir a algún lugar. Pensamos en personas como San Francisco Javier, que abandonaron su casa y viajaron a Asia para predicar el Evangelio. No es fácil ser misioneros. Sé por experiencia propia lo difícil que es. Es muy posible que Dios nos esté llamando hoy para ser el próximo Francisco Javier. La Iglesia nos necesita para difundir el Evangelio en todo el mundo.

La mayoría de nosotros no podremos ir a un país extranjero. Pero podemos hacer misiones en nuestros hogares y escuelas, despensas de alimentos, comedores, trabajos y amigos. Sabemos que la Iglesia nos llama a todos a la santidad y a hacer que el mundo que nos rodea sea santo.

Que el espíritu que llenó a San Pablo guíe y proteja a todos los misioneros. Oremos diariamente por el aumento de los misioneros y su éxito y seguridad. Apoyemos los esfuerzos misioneros de la Iglesia en oración, sacrificio y solidaridad.

From Fr Davy's Desk:

This weekend, Catholics around the world celebrate World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday, instituted in 1926 by Pope Pius XI calls us each year in the spirit of the Church's unity and universality, to a renewed commitment to everyone's responsibility for the spread of the Gospel message. Pope Francis has called for an "Extraordinary Missionary Month" to be celebrated in October, 2019 with the goal of fostering an increased awareness of our baptismal call *to be Missionaries*. Pope John Paul II, in his 1990 encyclical, "Redemptoris Missio," called World Mission Sunday "an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration and for all the missions of the world." If the original Apostles had not been missionary in their works, the Church would never have spread its presence around the world.

The Church is by her very nature missionary. Today two-thirds of humanity do not know Christ. They need to know him and his message of salvation. The Lord calls us to go beyond ourselves and to share with others the blessings we have received. Becoming missionary is an essential dimension to being a Catholic. We're all missionary by baptism, but until we begin to share our faith in some way with others, we have not become what we're being called to be by the Holy Spirit. Every member will dutifully participate in the universal mission of the Church through the efforts of our missionaries by prayer. Jesus himself spoke of the need "to pray always" (Lk 18:1).

Today we see with joy that missionaries come not only from the more established Churches but also from the Churches of Africa, Asia and Latin America. The World Mission Sunday is an invitation to all to have full solidarity with the missions. The material and financial needs of the missions are many and growing daily. Financial sacrifices from the faithful are essential for sustaining and building up the Church and for showing love.

We often think that to be Missionaries, we have to *go somewhere*. We think of people like the great Jesuit saint, Francis Xavier, who left his home, his family and his friends, and traveled around Asia for the rest of his life preaching the Gospel. We have a harder time seeing ourselves as Missionaries. I know from my own experience how challenging it is. It's very possible that God is calling us today to be the next Francis Xavier. The Church needs men and women who are willing to live their faith radically and heroically, and carry the Gospel into every corner of the earth.

Most of us, however, won't be called to preach in a foreign country. Most of us will work in the Mission fields of our homes and schools, our sports teams, food pantries, soup kitchen, jobs and friends. And the work will be just as demanding as it was for Francis Xavier, even if the people and places look familiar.

Two thousand years ago, St. Paul wrote to his followers, "*woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel.*" 1 Cor. 9:16 Those are strong words. It's easy to mistake what he meant. But Paul meant, If we don't share our faith with others, we begin to lose it ourselves. A lot of Catholics are embarrassed to talk about their faith. We may know that the Church calls all of us to holiness and to make the world around us holy.

May the spirit that filled Saint Paul guide and protect all missionaries and all who witness to Jesus in word, in deed and in the example of their lives. Let's pray daily for the increase of missionaries and their success and safety. Let's support the Church's missionary efforts in prayer, sacrifice and solidarity. May all find in Mary, who offered an unconditional "yes" to God, a model and inspiration for a successful missionary apostolate.

After 33 years of service, our Parish Secretary/Bookkeeper, Christine Bianculli, will be retiring at the end of this year.


This position will become available in January 2019. If you, or someone you know, would be interested in this position, please call the Rectory and speak to Fr. Davy or Christine.
