From Fr Davy's Desk:

Month of October is very special. The Holy Rosary, feast of two Carmelite Saints, World Mission Sunday, etc. gives October a spiritual picture. How do we integrate all these in our daily life?

Both Saint Teresa of Lisieux and Saint Theresa of Avila had zeal for missionary apostolate. At the age of seven Theresa of Avila ran away from home to become a missionary. She committed her whole life to reform the Carmelite religious life and evangelization. Her books, spiritual ecstasy, enthusiasm and intimacy with the Lord made her a faithful daughter and doctor of the Church.

Saint Teresa of Lisieux never did anything extraordinary. She never held any important responsibility. She suffered heroically in silence. Her spiritual autobiography revealed the richness of her spirituality to the world. She died at the age of 24. She never went to any mission. She was in the cloistered convent. How did she become the patroness of the missionaries? She offered all her suffering for the safety and success of the missionaries. She didn't do any research work or studies. Her simple theology of suffering and short cut to heaven qualified her to become a doctor of the Church.

Both these Saints prayed Rosary daily. During the month of October as we pray rosary solemnly in the church and at home let us follow their path of perfection. In our spiritual journey there might be several hurdles. Mother Mary walked with Jesus as he was carrying the cross to Calvary. Probably her silent accompaniment was a great support and strength to Jesus. In the same way when we pray Rosary daily the intercession of Mother Mary will help us to overcome the hardships in our faith journey. Therefore let us pray Rosary at home everyday.

El Mensaje del Padre Davy:

El mes de octubre es muy especial. El Santo Rosario, la fiesta de dos santos carmelitas, el Domingo de las Misiones Mundiales, etc., le da a octubre una imagen espiritual. ¿Cómo integramos todo esto en nuestra vida diaria?

Ambos Santa Teresa de Lisieux y Santa Teresa de Ávila tenían celo por el apostolado misionero. A la edad de siete años Santa Teresa de Ávila escapó de su casa para convertirse en misionera. Ella se comprometió toda su vida a reformar la vida religiosa carmelita y la evangelización. Sus libros, éxtasis espiritual, entusiasmo e intimidad con el Señor la convirtieron en una fiel hija y doctora de la Iglesia.

Santa Teresa de Lisieux nunca hizo nada extraordinario. Ella nunca tuvo ninguna responsabilidad importante. Ella sufrió heroicamente en silencio. Su autobiografía espiritual reveló la riqueza de su espiritualidad al mundo. Murió a la edad de 24 años. Nunca fue a ninguna misión. Ella estaba en el convento de clausura. ¿Cómo se convirtió en la patrona de los misioneros? Ella ofreció todo su sufrimiento por la seguridad y el éxito de los misioneros. Ella no hizo ningún trabajo de investigación o estudios. Su sencilla teología del sufrimiento y el atajo al cielo la capacitó para convertirse en una doctora de la Iglesia. Ambos santos rezaban el rosario diariamente.

Durante el mes de octubre, mientras rezamos solemnemente el rosario en la iglesia y en el hogar, sigamos su camino de perfección. En nuestro viaje espiritual puede haber varios obstáculos. La Madre María caminó con Jesús mientras llevaba la cruz al Calvario. Probablemente su acompañamiento silencioso fue un gran apoyo y fortaleza para Jesús. De la misma manera cuando rezamos el Rosario diariamente, la intercesión de la Madre María nos ayudará a superar las dificultades en nuestro viaje de fe. Por eso recemos el rosario en casa todos los días.

CHOIR

Praying the Rosary

Make the Sign of the Cross.

Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.

On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.

Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.

Say the *Glory Be*

For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery then say the *Our Father*.

While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten *Hail Marys* while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*.

(After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)

After saying the five decades, say the *Hail, Holy Queen*, followed by this dialogue and prayer:

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Mondays and Saturdays:

Joyful Mysteries: The Annunciation; The Visitation; The Nativity; The Presentation; The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple.

Tuesdays and Fridays:

Sorrowful Mysteries: The Agony of Jesus in the Garden; The Scourging at the Pillar; The Crowning with Thorns; The Carrying of the Cross; The Crucifixion.

Wednesdays and Sundays:

Glorious Mysteries: The Resurrection; The Ascension; The Descent of the Holy Spirit; The Assumption of Mary, the Mother of God, into heaven; The Coronation of Mary in heaven.

Thursdays:

Luminous Mysteries: The Baptism in the River Jordan; The Wedding Feast at Cana; The Preaching of the coming of the Kingdom of God; The Transfiguration; The Institution of the Holy Eucharist.
